AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO SELL, OFFER FOR SALE OR TO POSSESS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SALE ANY FIRE-WORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF WHEELER, DEFINING THE TERMS FIREWORKS AND PROVIDING A PENALTY, AND A SAVING CLAUSE.

SECTION 1,

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Wheeler that it shall hereinafter be unlawful for any person or firm to sell, offer for sale or to possess for the purpose of sale any fireworks of any kind or size in the City of Wheeler, Texas.

The term "fireworks" shall mean and include any firecracker, roman candle, torpedo, sky rocket or any other combustible package or contrivance of inflammable or combustible material, regardless of the name or whether named or not capable of producing audible, wisible or physical effects. SECTION 2.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars. SECTION 3,

The declaring of any section or portion of the above ordinance unconstitutional or in violation of the State or Federal law or city charter shall not effect the remaining sections or postions of such ordinance. SECTION 4.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force and effect from and after its passage.
