

ORDINANCE NO. 19

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF CHICKENS
AND OTHER FOWLS WITHIN THE CORPOR-
ATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF WHEELER,
TEXAS, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY
FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHEELER, TEXAS,
AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION No. 1 Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person firm or corporation to permit any chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, or any fowl of any kind to run at large, during the months of March, April, May, June and July, August and September of each year, within the in-corporated limits of said City. And any person, firm or corporation permitting any fowl to leave his own premises, or the premises he controls and allows same to stray upon the premises of another, same shall be deemed to be "run-at-large" as that term is hereinabove used.

SECTION No. 2 Any person firm, or corporation violating the provisions of the ORDINANCE shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Fifty Dollars.

This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.

Passed this 11th day of April A.D. 1929, at a regular meeting of the City Council of said City, a majority of said Council present and voting.
