

ORDINANCE NO. 36

WHEREAS, the General Telephone Company of the Southwest has presented information indicating that present local exchange revenues at Wheeler are not adequate, and

WHEREAS, application has been made for relief from this condition by an adjustment of its rates for local service, and

WHEREAS, under the conditions, said proposed schedule of rates appears to the City Council to be reasonable and just, and necessary to insure continued expansion and improvement of telephone service in the Wheeler Telephone Exchange, and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the right of the General Telephone Company of the Southwest to earn a fair return on the fair value of its property devoted to the rendition of local exchange telephone service to the customers of the Wheeler Exchange.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHEELER, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the General Telephone Company of the Southwest is hereby authorized to place into effect on its first billing date following the passage of this Ordinance, the following schedule of rates for local telephone service within the corporate limits of Wheeler and such other charges and rates for Miscellaneous Services as are included in its Texas General Exchange Tariff, a summary of which is attached:

Two Party Line Service	8.00
Extension	1.50
RESIDENCE:	
Individual Line Service	5.25
Two Party Line Service	4.50
Four Party Line Service	4.00
Extension	.75

Section 2. That nothing in this ordinance contained shall be construed in any manner, now or hereafter, limiting or modifying the right and power of the City Council under the law to regulate the rates charged by the General Telephone Company of the Southwest for its service within the City of Wheeler, Texas.
